SUBJECT: Report of Death

1. Private First Class Clarence N. Bush, 32596869, of Company "E", 32d Armored Regiment, was reported missing in action, in France, 2 August 1944, by ETO Shipment No. 158, and was presumed dead as of 3 August 1945, under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act, by SR&D No. 3758.

2. Private First Class Bush was posthumously awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge by Circular #151, W.D. 1945.

3. The AG 201 file of Private Bush contains a "Report Surrounding Personnel Missing in Action", dated 17 August 1944, executed by Headquarters, 32d Armored Regiment, which states that on 1 August 1944, Private Bush departed from a point six miles southeast of Brecey, France; that his mission was to "seize and secure high ground around the town of St. Barthelomy, France"; and that his last known whereabouts was the town of Juvigny. The paragraph concerning the resume of circumstances surrounding disappearance follows:

"Above man was a member of the crew of one of two tanks that were preceding the trains. They were cut off from the rest of the column in Juvigny, France and the two tanks were knocked out by Bazooka or Rifle Grenades."

4. The following crew members succeeding in getting out of the tank and are not under consideration herein:

5. Brecey, Juvigny and St. Barthelomy are towns located in northwestern France, south of St. Lo.

6. Former members of Company E, 32d Armored Regiment, were requested, by the Adjutant General in a letter dated 11 March 1949, to furnish any information they might have relative to the fate of Private Bush. The pertinent parts of letters received in reply to this request are quoted below:

Statement by George S. Mrotek:

"Pfc Bush was a member of a tank crew that was commanded by a S/Sgt Stolan at the time. That tank was hit by anti-tank fire as near as I recall at a town named Juvigny Le Tertre.

"In my opinion Pfc Bush was riding as loader in the tank which I know was hit. I viewed the tank after that and their (sic) was a charred mass that was once a body in the turret."

Statement by George Lorts:

"I believe that Bush burned to death in the tank. I was directly behind the tank of (sic) about an hour and I know that he didn't get out and no one could live in the fire that destroyed the tank."

Statement by Frank Audiffred:

"Bush was in Stolen Crew. *** Stolen moves up also getting hit. His tank caught fire. Three men came out. I didn't see Bush. If Bush was in that tank his body burned."

Statement by Sergeant Anton W. Miller:

"* * the tank in which Bush was a crew member was hit by a German Panzerfoust.

"My opinion is that Private Bush burned to death. I base my belief on the fact that the tank was completely burned, and Bush did not get out."

Statement by Joe Kutio:

"Pvt 1st Class Clarence N. Bush was in one of two tanks, that were knock (sic) out near St Bartholomy or Juvigny Le Tertre. I pass the two tanks which were five feet apart and the two tanks were burning. All men except two were accounted for. One of these was Bush. All men from the company I talk to that were near there, at the time, believe he never got out."

Statement by Paul E. Torrence:

"I was in the same company (E) as Pfc Bush, and on August 2, 1944 saw him get into the tank, in which he later lost his life. I saw the tank burn. Later I saw parts of human flesh picked up piece by piece of the men in the tank, and burned. Therefore, I naturally believe Pfc Bush to be dead."

7. The Office of the Quartermaster General, Memorial Division, forwarded to this office, a copy of a Record of Review and Approval, Non-Recoverable Case, which recommends that the remains of Private Bush be declared non-recoverable. This report states that efforts to correlate this case with records in that headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials were unsuccessful.

Attached to the above report is a report from Headquarters, 320 Armored Regiment dated 26 August 1945, which reveals that the tank in question was hit by Bazooka fire on the turret side near Loader's position; that the tank was completely burned and the bottom blown out; that while the tank was only seen from the distance it was believed that it would have been impossible for anyone to have survived had he remained in the tank.

8. Private First Class Bush was a crew member (Loader) of one of two tanks, which were preceding and protecting trains during an advance toward St. Bartholomy, France, on 2 August 1944. Both tanks were separated from the remainder of the column and put out of operation by enemy fire at Juvigny, France. The tank occupied by Private Bush and four other crew members, was hit by Bazooka fire on the turret side near Loader's position, burned and exploded. The remaining four crew members escaped from the vehicle; two were later reported "Died of Wounds", one was taken prisoner, and one returned to military control. Due to the fact that the enemy regained the area, an immediate search for subject person was precluded, however, a later field investigation proved negative. Unknown recovered from the area have either been identified or declared unidentifiable. Eyewitnesses to the incident expressed the opinion that Private Bush remained in the tank and was killed when the tank caught on fire and exploded. In view of these circumstances and the fact that no report regarding him has been received in the five and one half years which have elapsed since he disappeared it is considered that sufficient evidence exists to justify the conclusion that the subject person was killed in action when his tank was hit by Bazooka fire, caught on fire and exploded in Juvigny, France.

9. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death, and that a casualty report be initiated stating that the person named in paragraph one, above, was killed in action on 2 August 1944, when his tank was hit by Bazooka fire, caught on fire and exploded in Juvigny, France. The casualty report and official report of death will include the following statement:

"Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 3 August 1945. This 'Report of Death' is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9."

SUBJECT: Review and Determination of Status
Under the Missing Persons Act.

1. - FACTS

1. The following-named person of Company "E", 32nd Armored Regiment, has been carried on War Department records as missing in action, since 2 August 1944, in France, as reported by ETO Shipment No. 158:

2. This enlisted man's Ag 201 file contains a "Report Surrounding Personnel Missing in Action", dated 17 August 1944, executed by Headquarters, 32nd Armored Regiment. It states that on 1 August 1944, Private Bush departed from a point six miles southeast of Brecey, France; that his mission was to "seize and secure high ground around town of St. Barthelemy, France"; and that his last known whereabouts was the town of Juvigny. The paragraph concerning the resume of circumstances surrounding disappearance follows:

"Above man was a member of the crew of one of two tanks that were preceding the trains. They were cut off from the rest of the column in Juvigny, France and the two tanks were knocked out by Bazooka or Rifle Grenades."

There are no statements of witnesses, no report of search, and no additional information given in the report.

3. Brecey, Juvigny, and St. Barthelemy are towns located in north-western France, south of St. Lo.

4. An examination of the files of this person in Casualty Branch and enlisted Branch, AGO, and of the Index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PMGO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review.

II. - CONCLUSIONS

1. Private Bush was a crew member of one of the two tanks that were preceding and protecting trains during an advance toward St. Barthelemy, France, on 2 August 1944. He became missing in action when both tanks were separated from the remainder of the column and put out of operation by enemy fire at Juvigny, which is in the St. Lo area.

2. Although it is twelve months since Private Bush became missing in action, and approximately three months since the cessation of hostilities in Europe, no report has been received in the War Department to indicate that he is alive.

3. In view of the foregoing facts and circumstances, it is concluded that Private Bush may not reasonably be presumed to be living.

III. - RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that a finding of death be made under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act, in the case of Private First Class Clarence N. Bush, 32,596,869, and that this finding show the presumed date of death to be 3 August 1945.

SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above was a crew member (loader) of one of two tanks that were preceding and protecting trains during an advance toward St. Barthelemy, France, on 2 August 1944. Both tanks were separated from the remainder of the column and put out of operation by enemy fire at Juvigny. The tank, occupied by Pfc Bush and 4 other crew members, was hit by Bazooka fire on the turret side near loader's position, burned and exploded. The remaining four crew members escaped from the vehicle; 2 were later reported "Dead of Wounds", and one was taken prisoner. It is not known what became of Pfc Bush as the enemy regained the area which fact prevented a search for the missing soldier. Seen from a distance the tank appeared completely burned and the bottom blown out. It is presumed that the remains of Pfc Bush were totally destroyed in the burning and exploding tank. Field investigation proved negative. Unknowns recovered from the area have either been identified or declared unidentifiable. It is believed that all clues have been exhausted and that a further search for the remains of this soldier would be futile.

Reference is made to OQMG Form 371; Letter, 2nd Zone, dated 6 March 1947; Casualty Clearance Plan.

2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records in file headquarters American Graves Registration Command.

3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in US Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.


