

1. It is recommended that the Board take action on the following cases:

DATE OF DEATH: 17 August 1944

PLACE OF DEATH: Vicinity of Flassans, France

SYNOPSIS: The above mentioned unresolved casualties comprised part of the crew of a light Tank of the 756 Tank Battalion, which received direct hits from enemy fire, exploded and burned in the vicinity of Flassans, France on 17 August 1944. A Frenchman, G. Pastorello, was a witness to the incident and indicates that he saw three men leave the tank at the time of the first shell hit and then viewed the same men enter the tank again. At the time of the third shell hit the Frenchman only saw one man leave the tank. There are no records on file this headquarters indicating the fate of the remainder of the crew and listings this headquarters show that the two subject deceased were the only casualties of the 756 Tank Battalion on 17 August 1944. Field Investigations were conducted in the area in September 1947 and March 1950 with negative results. Attempts to associate unknowns recovered from the area with subject decedents were also negative. It is logical to conclude that S/Sgt. Roy (NMI) De Ciero and Cpl James F. Feeney were killed when their

tank was hit by enemy shell fire, exploded and burned and that their remains were reduced by the fire to a state that precludes recovery. The fact that Field Investigations were negative and the fact that there are no unknowns on record that may be associated with the subject casualties would tend to substantiate this conclusion. It is therefore recommended that this case be deemed Non-Recoverable.

2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records on file at the Hq, American Graves Registration Detachment.

3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this Hq pertaining to Unknown deceased interred in US Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

4. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

D I A R Y

Arrived Flassans 0830: hours.

At the Town-Hall several witnesses and Mr. Pastorello Georges confirmed that on 17 August 1944 at the time of the Liberation an American tank was destroyed about 1,500 km from the town. The tank was hit several times by german shell guns, it started burning and was left by the soldiers. According to Mr. Pastorello's statements 4 American soldiers were killed. The corpse of the soldiers were not intact and according to him parts of a body were buried at the place where the tank was destroyed. We took the witness along as well as the local policeman and we went to the place where the bodies were buried. In spite of our searching we could not find anything owing to the fact that the fields were ploughed several times since then.

The town-hall has no information pertaining to the names of the occupants of the tank.

At 1100: hours contacted the Brigade Commander of the Gendarmerie, same negative statements. We finally conducted our investigation in order to find out whether or not the bodies of the American soldiers had been buried in the cemetery of Gonfaron. The latter information obtained at Flassans was not exact, we found out that no bodies of American soldiers had been buried in the territory of the Commune of Gonfaron. The remains were taken to a military Hospital which was stationed at the time near Gonfaron and this led the people of Flassans to be mistaken in regard to the place where said remains were buried.

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

I. MATTERS INVESTIGATED

Pursuant to instructions contained in I.D. #151, S & R Team # 5, conducted an investigation in the vicinity of Brignoles, Cuers, Puget-Ville, Hyeres, Carnoules and Flassans, Var, France, on 27 and 28 March 1950, in an effort to locate the remains of Feeney, Frank F. Cpl 31094370, and De Ciero, Roy, S/Sgt 39155786, members of Co "C" 756th Tank Bn, KIA 17 August 1944.

II. FINDINGS

The search proved futile in all vicinities with the exception of Flassans, Var, France.

Exhibit "A" is a statement of Georges Pastorello, who was an eyewitness to the destruction of an american tank and the loss of two American soldiers, 17 August 1944, about 1 1/2 miles southeast of Flassans, France.

Mr. Magne, Maire of Flassans, says that this tank was removed by some junk dealers about two years ago. It was impossible to obtain the name of the junk dealer.

Mr. Boyier, Secretary to the Maire of Gonfaron, France, says the American tank moved into the area 16 August 1944. He is positive that no american soldiers were buried in the local cemetery. The cemetery records were examined, the search was negative.

The scene of the tragedy was investigated. Nothing could be found that might lead to the identification of the destroyed tank.

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the record of evacuation of remains from the vicinity of Flassans, be re-examined in an effort to locate disposition of the remains taken from this tank.

Reference is made to your letter requesting additional information concerning the death of your brother.

Your desire to be fully informed regarding the death of your brother, Cpl. James F Feeney, 31,094,370, Infantry is most understandable. Additional information has now been received which confirms the previous report of death and shows that he was killed in action 17 Aug.1944 in the vicinity of Flassens, France. Death was the result of cremation which his tank was destroyed by fire.

With reference to your statement regarding your brothers' whereabouts prior to his death, the records show that he left Naples, Italy on 9 Aug.1944 and participated in the invasion of Southern France on 15 Aug.1944.

The Effects Quartermaster, Army Effects Bureau, Kansas City Missouri, has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to personal effects of our military personnel who die overseas. A copy of your letter has accordingly been forwarded to that officer for necessary action.

Permit me to extend my sympathy to you and the members of your family in the loss of your brother.

AFTER ACTION REPORT

On 16 August 1944, C Company held road blocks north, west and south of COLLABRIERES, and moved at 2000B to GONFARON, being relieved by Company B. Company A operated the entire day in support of the 7th Infantry Regiment, advancing against considerable opposition in the direction of HYERES. 430

On August 17, C Company moved toward BRIGNOLES, reaching that vicinity at dark against considerable opposition. Company B continued to support the 15th Infantry, reaching CUERS and PUGE-VILLE. Company A continued to support the 7th Infantry, pushing toward HYERES against stiff opposition. At 2100B orders were received attaching one platoon of Company D to the 3rd Reconnaissance Troop. The platoon moved out about 2200B to the vicinity of CARNOULES. 36

On 18 August 1944, the remainder of Company D was attached to the 3rd Reconnaissance Troop. Company C continued to support the attack on BRIGNOLES, penetrating the town about 2400B hours. Companies A and B continued to support the 7th Infantry and 15th Infantry Regiments. Company D established road blocks southwest of TOURVES and engaged enemy vehicles and patrols about 2200B.

August 19 saw continuation of attachments with Company C, assisting in the capture of BRIGNOLES, Company B occupying ROCQUEBRUS-SANNE, Company A was relieved and marched to the vicinity of BESSE. Company D reconnoitered roads northwest, west, and south from TOURVES, and occupied ST MAXIMIN. At noon, the battalion was ordered to assemble Company A, Company B (- 1 Platoon) and Company C (- 1 Platoon) near Besse to reorganize and to perform maintenance.

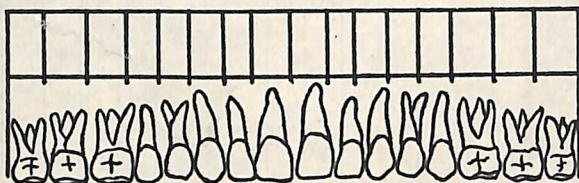

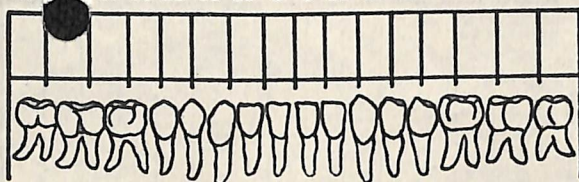
