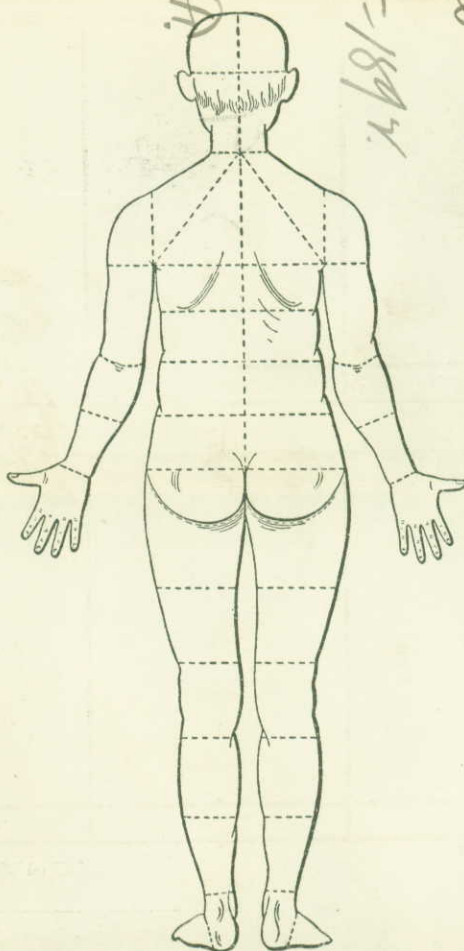
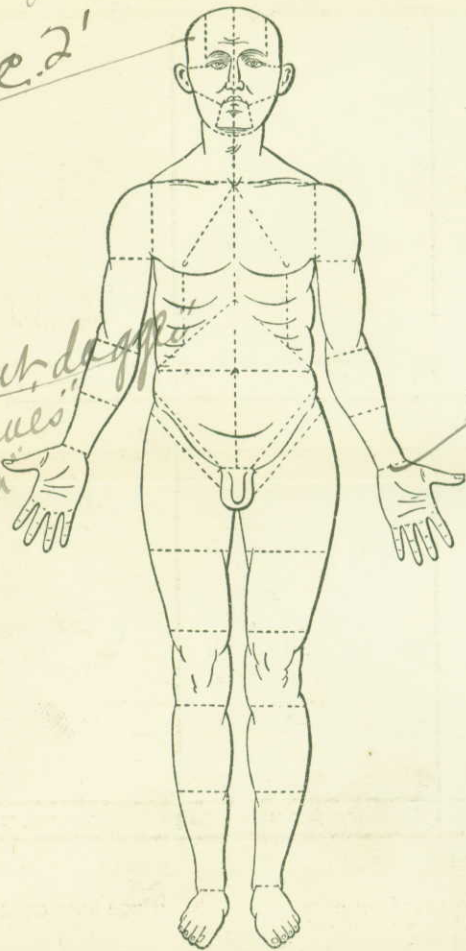

You are hereby notified that as the dependent mother of the late
George Charles Anderson, C. B. M., U. S. N. who died Sept. 26th 1918
as a result of injuries received in the line of duty in the naval

service of the United States, you are awarded compensation in the
amount of fifteen and 00/100 dollars per month, from the 27th day of Sept., 1918,
in accordance with the Act of Congress of October 6, 1917 and the amendments
thereto.

The payment of compensation to a widow shall continue until her death
or remarriage; compensation to a dependent parent shall continue during the period
of actual dependency; compensation to a child shall continue until such child
reaches the age of eighteen years or marries, or if such child be incapable be-
cause of insanity or idiocy, or being otherwise permanently helpless then during
such incapacity.

IMPORTANT PROVISIONS OF THE ACT

Sec. 27 - That whoever shall obtain or receive any money, check, allot-
ment, family allowance, compensation, or insurance under Articles II, III, or IV of
this Act, without being entitled thereto, with intent to defraud the United States
or any person in the military or naval forces of the United States, shall be pun-
ished by a fine of not more than \$2,000, or by imprisonment for not more than one
year, or both.

Sec. 28 - That the allotments and family allowances, compensation, and
insurance payable under Articles II, III, and IV, respectively, shall not be as-
signable; shall not be subject to the claims of creditors of any person to whom
an award is made under Articles II, III, or IV; and shall be exempt from all taxa-
tion: Provided, That such allotments and family allowances, compensation and in-
surance shall be subject to any claims which the United States may have, under
Articles II, III, and IV, against the person on whose account the allotments and
family allowances, compensation, or insurance is payable.

The initial payment check pursuant to the award approved in your favor
will be dispatched to you at the earliest possible moment. If you should change
your present address, the Compensation Claims Section, Bureau of War Risk Insur-
ance, Washington, D. C., must be immediately notified. All future communications
with reference to this case must bear the Compensation number C-50097.

5. Immediately upon the receipt of these orders, you will send the following despatch to the Bureau of Navigation: "For Detail Officer Your Registered 2 July received".
6. Upon arrival in a foreign port, and before permitting any of the armed guard to go ashore, consult with the United States Consul. Furnish the Consul with a complete list of the armed guard and obtain from him a certificate of identification for each man.

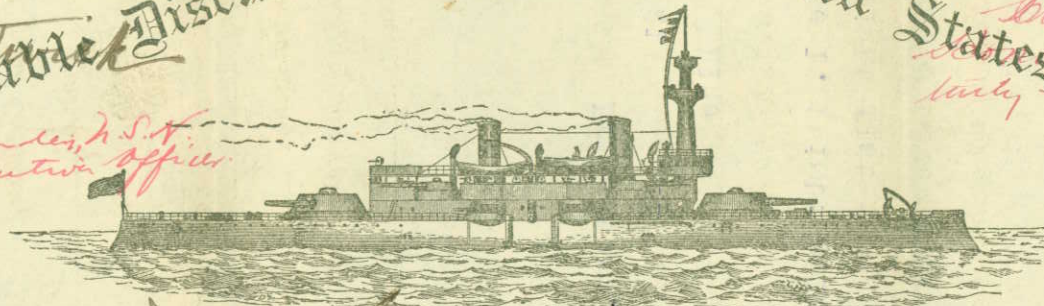

Memorandum for information of relatives of men who die
in the Naval Service.

Under provisions of War Risk Insurance Act of October 6, 1917 the following benefits are provided for families of men who die in the Naval Service:

- a. War Risk Insurance (provided the deceased made application for it).
- b. Compensation.
- c. Funeral expenses not to exceed \$100.

The Bureau of War Risk Insurance has been notified of the death of your relative and has been asked to forward claim blanks.

INSURANCE

Insurance is payable only to the beneficiary designated by the officer or enlisted man and only in cases where such applications for Insurance were made as provided by Law. Payment will be made in 240 monthly payments, that is covering a period of 20 years. The maximum payments for a policy of \$10,000, is \$57.50 per month. For a policy of \$5,000, \$28.75 per month. Such payments will be made by the War Risk Insurance Bureau and you should therefore sign and return claim blanks which they will send to you.

COMPENSATION

The only persons entitled to receive compensation in case of death are the widow, children, or dependent widowed mother of the deceased. Compensation is paid only when death occurs in line of duty and the monthly sums then payable are as follows:

- a. For a widow alone, \$25.
- b. For a widow and one child, \$35.
- c. For a widow and two children, \$47.50, with \$5 for each additional child up to two.
- d. If there be no widow, then for one child, \$20.
- e. For two children, \$30.
- f. For three children, \$40, with \$5 for each additional child up to two.
- g. For a widowed mother, \$20. The amount payable under this subdivision shall not be greater than a sum which, when added to the total amount payable to the widow and children, does not exceed \$75.

Compensation to a widow or widowed mother continues until death or remarriage; compensation to a child shall cease at the age of eighteen or at marriage, unless the child is incompetent.

FUNERAL ALLOWANCE

The War Risk Insurance Bureau is authorized by Law to pay reasonable funeral expenses not to exceed \$100, this upon written application therefore. Application for such expenses should be made to the War Risk Insurance Bureau by the person who incurred expenses and should be accompanied by an itemized account, and if possible receipted bills.

Claim for pay or money due the deceased — and by that is meant the money he had actually earned and which was due him on the books at the time of his death — may be made direct by the relatives to the Auditor for the Navy Department, Treasury Department, Washington, D. C.

You are advised that employment of an attorney or claim agent to collect any of above amounts is not necessary and will only put you to useless expense. The Bureau of Navigation offers its services in giving you any further information.



My dear Mr. Anderson:-

Your letter of October 10th addressed to the Bureau of Navigation wherein you inquire as to the circumstances surrounding the death of your son, George Charles Anderson, late Chief Boatswain's Mate, U.S. Navy, has been referred to me for reply. I regret very much the apparent long delay in answering, which under existing conditions is unavoidable.

While the SARANAC was out at sea on September 26th, the protective gear rigged out to shield the ship's bottom from possible contact with mines became fouled. There being an element of personal hazard in the attempt which must be made to clear the tangle, Anderson, as was his custom, promptly took the lead himself and in the subsequent effort to straighten out the difficulty was accidentally dislodged from his footing and fell overboard. Two life rings and a life jacket were immediately thrown overboard and every available pair of eyes on board were strained for a glimpse of him but he did not reappear. The ship was maneuvered so a thorough search of the surrounding water could be made but beyond locating the life rings and jacket, no trace of him was found.

Whenever there was any work connected with seamanship to be performed involving personal risk, your son invariably took it himself and would not permit others so to do. For this and his other excellent traits he was virtually idolized by the members of the crew in the deck force and his loss is our loss manifold.

Your son's effects were sold at auction in accordance with naval regulations among members of the ship's crew. The proceeds from the sale were turned in to the Supply Officer for accounting, as is customary, together with other moneys due your son. Eventually this money will be paid to his next of kin when application is made upon the Auditor for the Navy Department, Treasury Department, Washington, D.C. The disposition of his uniforms to his shipmates was, I feel sure, such as your son would have wished. One Chief Petty Officer in particular purchased at the auction your son's cap with the intention of holding it so that it might be sent to Anderson's parents if they wished it and he now welcomes the opportunity of sending it on. The cap will be mailed after the ship arrives in the United States -

this in order to prevent its being unduly crushed in the mails.

Regrettable as the loss of your son is, at the same time it is alleviation of the pain to know that his memory on the ship from which he was lost is held in such affection and respect.

When a mark below 5 is assigned in sobriety or obedience for a quarter in which no offense is shown on the record the cause for such action must be entered in the column of offenses.

3. Should the final recommendations regarding Honorable Discharge and Good Conduct Medal not accord with the record, due weight being given to the recommendations of all other captains under whom the man may have served during his current enlistment, as shown by his enlistment record, the commanding officer must state on the enlistment record clearly and concisely, over his own signature, the reasons for such recommendations.

4. In cases of men reenlisting immediately on board of the vessel from which discharged, an entry showing the original place of enlistment must be made on the enlistment record.

5. On pages 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 it will be noted that the lines are numbered. These pages take the place of the old form of enlistment record, and the entries at the "end of quarter," "transfer," etc., should be made on the same numbered lines if possible. The commanding officer's signature in the column "Signature of Commanding Officer" is an acknowledgment of all entries between the line on which his signature is placed and the last entry by himself or a previous commanding officer.

6. In the column "Meritorious Conduct, Offenses," etc., page 8, the commanding officer, on the transfer or discharge of a petty officer, first class, or chief petty officer, or upon his own detachment, shall note whether or not the man possesses qualifications for future consideration for appointment as a warrant officer. When petty officers of lower ratings are considered especially well fitted, this same note may be made on their records at the discretion of the commanding officer.

7. On page 12, "Details," note will be made in the proper column of the character of duty performed by the petty officers, with dates at the beginning and completion thereof, especially when regularly detailed in the following cases: Electricians detailed for wireless; gunners' mates for electrical work, battery, or torpedoes and mines; machinists' mates for ordnance or electrical work; quartermasters, whether for ship or signal; yeomen, whether for captain, executive, ordnance officer, navigator, equipment, engineer, or pay department, or in charge of ship's store; and any other detail showing special aptitude, knowledge of which would be valuable to succeeding commanding officers; musicians, note the instrument they play; also when a man is detailed as messman, compartment cleaner, jack-of-the-dust, ice-machine tender, evaporator tender, or other special detail, with period so detailed.

8. No interlineations, erasures, alterations, or use of ditto marks will be permitted. Should an error be made, a light red-ink line will be drawn through it, the commanding or executive officer entering his initials alongside in ink.

9. The signatures of commanding officers to all final entries on enlistment records closed by discharge, desertion, or death, and to every quarter in which a court-martial or change of rating has occurred, must be written, not stamped.

10. The stubs in the back of the book are for the insertion of the Gunnery Record, Acting and Permanent Appointments, which will be inserted with a view of removal and delivery to the man on his discharge, the perforated line being for detachment.

3. Should the final recommendations regarding Honorable Discharge and Good Conduct Medal not accord with the record, due weight being given to the recommendations of all other captains under whom the man may have served during his current enlistment, as shown by his enlistment record, the commanding officer must state on the enlistment record clearly and concisely, over his own signature, the reasons for such recommendations.

4. In cases of men reenlisting immediately on board of the vessel from which discharged, an entry showing the original place of enlistment must be made on the enlistment record.

5. On pages 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 it will be noted that the lines are numbered. These pages take the place of the old form of enlistment record, and the entries at the "end of quarter," "transfer," etc., should be made on the same numbered lines if possible. The commanding officer's signature in the column "Signature of Commanding Officer" is an acknowledgment of all entries between the line on which his signature is placed and the last entry by himself or a previous commanding officer.

6. In the column "Meritorious Conduct, Offenses," etc., page 8, the commanding officer, on the transfer or discharge of a petty officer, first class, or chief petty officer, or upon his own detachment, shall note whether or not the man possesses qualifications for future consideration for appointment as a warrant officer. When petty officers of lower ratings are considered especially well fitted, this same note may be made on their records at the discretion of the commanding officer.

7. On page 12, "Details," note will be made in the proper column of the character of duty performed by the petty officers, with dates at the beginning and completion thereof, especially when regularly detailed in the following cases: Electricians detailed for wireless; gunners' mates for electrical work, battery, or torpedoes and mines; machinists' mates for ordnance or electrical work; quartermasters, whether for ship or signal; yeomen, whether for captain, executive, ordnance officer, navigator, equipment, engineer, or pay department, or in charge of ship's store; and any other detail showing special aptitude, knowledge of which would be valuable to succeeding commanding officers; musicians, note the instrument they play; also when a man is detailed as messman, compartment cleaner, jack-of-the-dust, ice-machine tender, evaporator tender, or other special detail, with period so detailed.

8. No entries and erasures, alterations, or use of ditto marks will be permitted. Should an error be made, a light red-ink line will be drawn through it, the commanding or executive officer entering his initials alongside in ink.

9. The signatures of commanding officers to all final entries on enlistment records closed by discharge, desertion, or death, and to every quarter in which a court-martial or change of rating has occurred, must be written, not stamped.

10. The stubs in the back of the book are for the insertion of the Gunnery Record, Acting and Permanent Appointments (now issued in a new form for use with this new service record). Appointments will be inserted with a view of removal and delivery to the man on his discharge, the perforated line being for detachment.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING GUNNERY RECORDS.

NAVY DEPARTMENT,
BUREAU OF NAVIGATION.

1. These forms and instructions are provided to secure a uniform, systematic record of the gunnery experience and qualifications of all men that fill certain gun stations, from the time of their first detail until discharged. These records will be used for men regularly detailed as sight setters or 2d or 1st pointers, and for any men that fire the guns at any practice in the temporary absence of any of the above, also for gun captains and turret captains. Once a man is detailed to any one of these stations or as a supernumerary pointer, a gunnery record shall be begun for him, and shall be continued throughout his current enlistment.

2. Men under training as gun pointers, in addition to those regularly stationed as such, by order of the Bureau of Navigation or of the commanding officer, shall be classed as "Supernumerary Pointers." A qualified pointer not stationed as a gun pointer at any gun shall be classed as an "Extra Pointer."

3. The gunnery officer shall make the entries on the gunnery records. The scores entered shall be taken from the copy of the "Report of Scores" bearing the signature of the chief umpire, not from a manifold copy. Upon transfer or discharge, the record shall be completed to date, signed by the commanding officer, and transmitted with the man's Enlistment Record.

4. Fill out a line for each target practice that is carried out by the ship on which the man is serving; and in case he does not fire at any practice, it shall be so stated in the "Remarks" column, with the reasons therefor. If the man is assigned to a new station at the gun (for instance, promoted from sight setter to 2d pointer, 2d pointer to 1st pointer, or from substitute to any of the above stations), or shifted to another gun, or to another ship, begin a new line, entering in second column the date of the man's assignment to his new duties.

5. When a qualified pointer is not stationed as a pointer or is not stationed at a gun at which he has qualified, the reasons shall be stated in the "Remarks" column, and shall be immediately reported to the Bureau of Navigation, through the commander in chief or squadron commander.

6. For a turret captain or a gun captain (except at secondary battery guns), in filling out the columns constituting the "Target Practice Record," give the record of the *turret* of which he has charge, or of the *gun* (average of the two pointers), as the case may be.

7. The Gunnery Record being a man's sole certificate of qualification as a gun pointer, and the amount and term of his extra pay being determined by it, special care must be observed in filling out the columns according to instructions.
