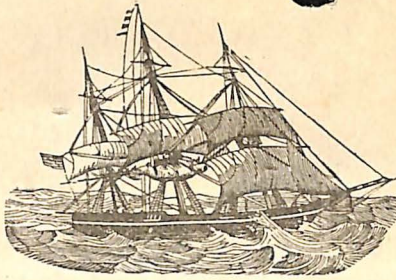

1. In recommending the character to be given a marine on discharge, the nature of his service during the entire period of his current enlistment, as shown by his descriptive list and conduct record, will govern, due weight being given to the markings of his former commanding officers and the opportunities possessed by such commanding officers for arriving at their conclusions, as indicated by the respective periods the marine served under them, being duly considered.

2. In no case will a marine who has been legally convicted by a court martial, and the sentence of such court been approved by proper authority, be recommended for character "excellent."

3. Commanding officers will also carefully consider the fact that the markings given the marine during his recruit service will necessarily not be excellent. Should commanding officers, therefore, give undue weight to such markings, only reenlisted marines could ever receive character "excellent."

4. The desired end to be obtained is that the character given the marine on discharge shall reflect and be exactly descriptive of the man's general service in the Marine Corps during the enlistment from which the particular discharge releases him.

NOTE.—This book should be forwarded through official channels to the Adjutant and Inspector, U. S. Marine Corps, at the expiration of the soldier's enlistment, also in case of desertion or death. Should a deserter surrender or be taken, application will be made at once to the Adjutant and Inspector for his record.

When a man deserts, or is apprehended or surrendered, the word "deserted," "apprehended," or "surrendered" will be entered over the date in the column headed "Transfer."

In every case of transfer a note should be made in the proper place as to a man's qualification in marksmanship and the range fired on.

In making entries in this descriptive book the strictest economy of space must be observed and no blank lines should be left between entries.

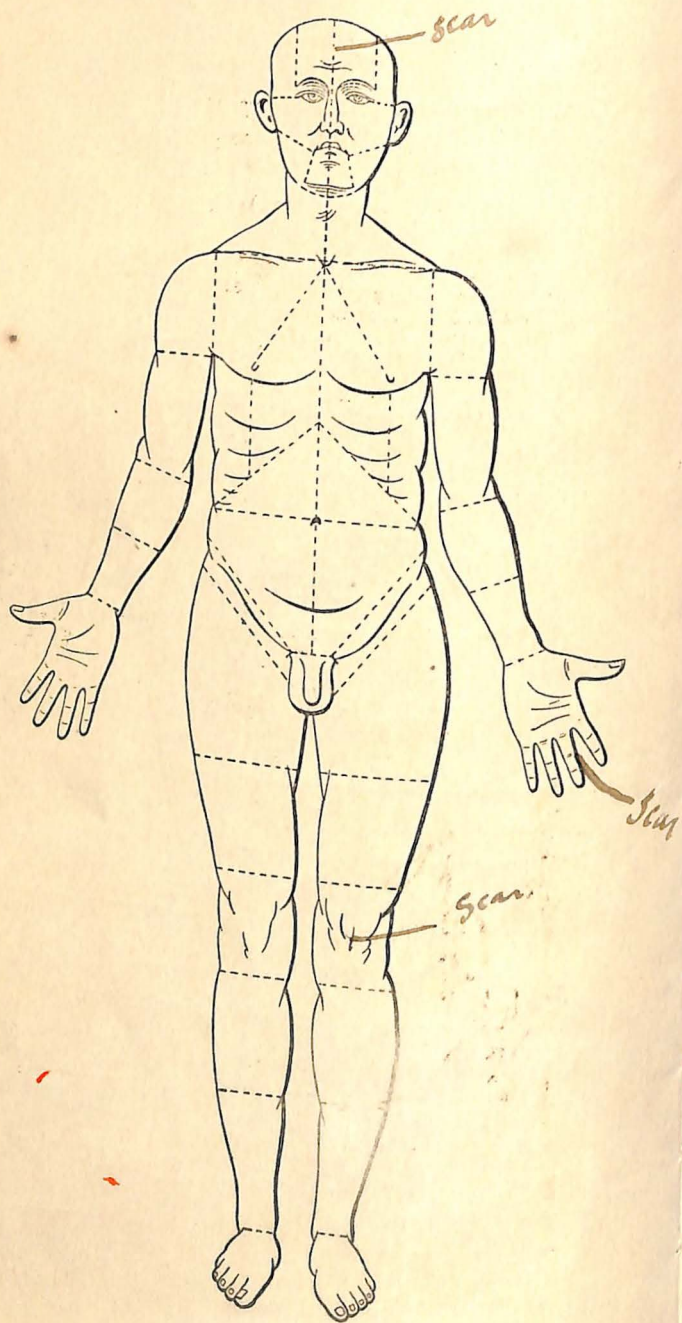

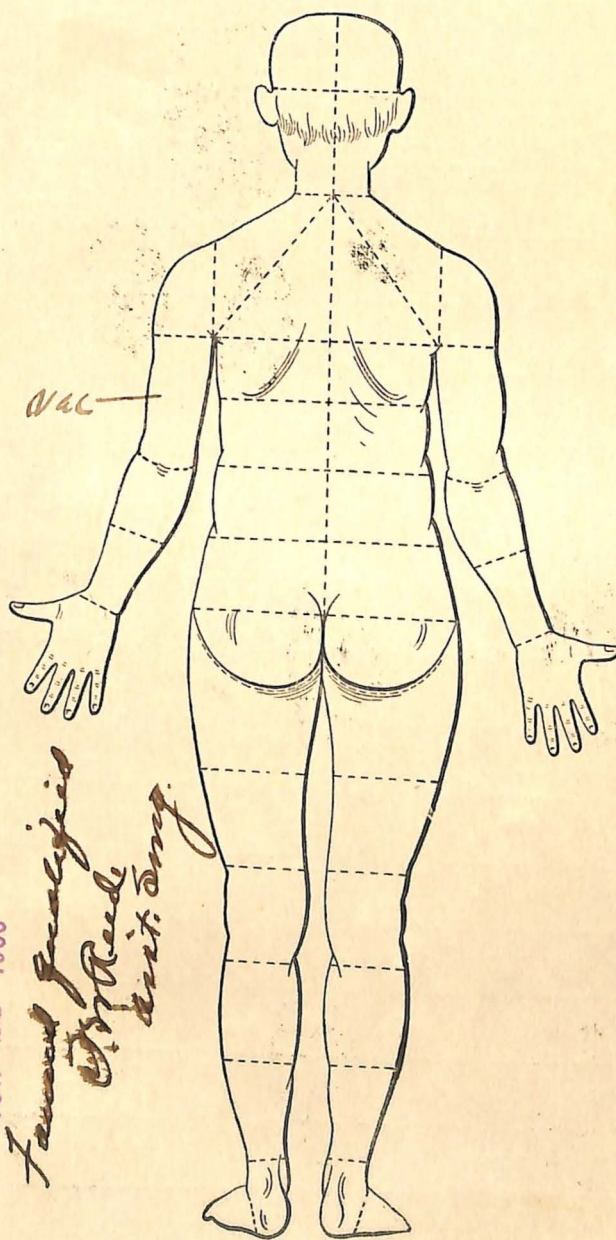

# HEALTH RECORD OF Cullen, Edward J.

(To be entered in case of transfer, discharge, desertion, or death.)

In the final column the medical officer should select only those diseases or injuries from the medical record for brief mention therein which may have an important bearing upon: (1) Future health; (2) A continuance of treatment of certain diseases; (3) The findings of a board of medical survey, as to injuries, etc.; (4) Qualifications (physical) for reenlistment, or in furnishing any further information of value to succeeding medical officers in connection with physical or mental conditions or fitness for the service. This book becomes a part of the st company him throughout his enlistment. Prior to the expiration of a marine's death, or retirement, this book will be sent to the Major General, Commandant and Inspector, U. S. Marine Corps.

All entries will be made throughout the book in accordance with the printed headings, special attention being directed to the following:

**ENLISTMENTS.**—When a man enlists, his name, rank, and date of enlistment only will be entered on the front cover; page 1 will be filled in and signed by the recruiting officer and the recruit, and pages 2 and 3 should be filled in and signed by the medical examiner.

**JOININGS.**—When a man joins, surrenders, or is apprehended, entry thereof will be made on pages 4 to 7.

Upon arrival at a post from recruiting office the recruit should be reexamined and note of reexamination and any discrepancies found made on pages 2 and 3 and signed by the surgeon.

**TRANSFERS.**—When a marine is transferred proper entries will be made on pages 4 to 7, 9 to 13, 14 to 17, and 20.

**DESERPTION.**—When a man deserts proper entries will be made on pages 4 to 7 (giving "0" in obedience), 9 to 13, and 14 to 17. On pages 9 to 13 entries will be made of such, if any, of the following circumstances attending the desertion as may be known: Disposal of effects, especially uniforms; secret preparations for desertion; procuring plain clothes; declarations to comrades and known desire to quit the service; taking passage for distant point; escaping from arrest and quitting the immediate vicinity of his station and duty; the commission of an offense and fear of punishment therefor. Entry will also be made of the hour and date, place or port of desertion, and whether or not a reward has been offered. Upon desertion a copy of the reward offered, if any, will be forwarded with the book to Headquarters.

**DEATH.**—In the event of death proper entries will be made on pages 4 to 7, and 14 to 17. On pages 14 to 17 the hour, date, place, and cause of death, and date, place of burial, or disposition of remains should also be entered.

**RETIREMENT.**—When a man is retired, entries will be made as in case of transfer, and the book forwarded to Headquarters.

**FOR DISCHARGE.**—Before the service record of the man is forwarded to Headquarters for preparation of discharge certificate, his commanding officer will enter on pages 4 to 7 the markings to which the man is entitled for service while under his command. On the following line will be entered the marks to which he appears to be entitled for the whole of his enlistment, said markings being determined from an examination of his previous markings, offenses committed and punishments awarded, due weight being given to the opportunities possessed by his former commanding officers for arriving at their conclusions, as indicated by the periods the man served under each. Undue weight should not be given the markings received for service as a recruit.

The surgeon should fill in certificate on inside back cover.

The character proposed to be given upon discharge, and, when discharged upon expiration of enlistment, whether or not the man is recommended for a good-conduct medal upon reenlistment, will be noted upon the inside of the back cover. When the markings for discharge average four and one-half or over, the man should be recommended for character "Excellent" and the award of a good-conduct medal should he reenlist. A man will not be recommended for a good-conduct medal, however, if during his current enlistment he has been legally convicted by a general or summary court-martial and the sentence approved by proper authority.

**DISCHARGE.**—When a man is discharged before the staff returns are forwarded to Headquarters, the book will be closed in the same manner as when forwarding *For Discharge*, and the form on the back cover will be changed to show the character actually given on the discharge certificate.

In the case of a general court-martial prisoner additional signed entry will be made, pages 4 to 7, to show what was actually furnished him upon discharge, including the amount of cash paid, whether or not it included transportation, and whether or not clothing was furnished.

**EXPEDITIONS,** distinguished service, letters of commendation, badges awarded, etc., will be noted on page 8.

**GOOD-CONDUCT** medals or bars awarded will be noted on page 8.

**OFFENSES** committed and punishments awarded will be entered on pages 9 to 13. When a man is in the hands of the civil authorities the hours and dates from and to which so detained, whether absent without leave when arrested, offense charged, and whether convicted or acquitted, will be entered.

**COURTS-MARTIAL.**—A brief abstract of general and summary courts-martial and deck courts will be entered on or attached to pages 9 to 13, the approving authority (G. C. M., convening authority; S. C. M., senior officer present; D. C., convening authority) being shown, together with date of approval.

**PROMOTIONS** and reductions will be noted on page 18.

**DETAILS** on extra or special duty will be noted on page 19.

**MARKSMANSHIP** will be recorded on pages 20 to 22.

**VACCINATION.**—Date and result of vaccination will be entered on inside back cover.

In making entries in this book the strictest economy of space must be observed, no blank lines being left between entries. If more space is needed, additional pages should be inserted.
