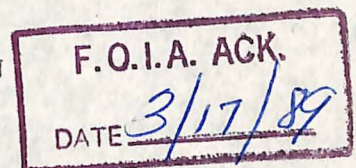



SUBJECT: Commissioning of Axel Enholm.

1. On June 5, 1918, Sergeant Axel Enholm, of 'B' Company, this Battalion was wounded in action and evacuated to an S.O.S. Hospital. He was carried on the muster roll of 'B' Company as wounded in action on the 5th of June, and in an S.O.S. Hospital from June 5th to July 12th, and transferred to Hospital on July 13th.

2. In June, 1918, authority was granted this Battalion to commission three enlisted men and Lieutenant Enholm was one of the three selected but was at that time in the Hospital. Two men were commissioned and the third commission of the Battalions' quota was left open for Sergeant Enholm. He did not return to this Battalion from the Hospital until September 2, 1918, and on September 3rd he was enrolled as the third man from the Battalions' June quota, his commission being dated back to June 28th, which was the date the other two men had been enrolled. It was not learned until September 11th that another man in the Brigade had been commissioned in his stead due to his prolonged absence in the Hospital. He was then picked up on the rolls of 'B' Company as a Sergeant, the rank he had previously held. On the 25th of September he was discharged to accept a commission as Second Lieutenant, (Provisional) in the Marine Corps Reserve, class four, and enrolled on the 26th as part of the quota allotted to this Battalion in September, taking oath of office the same date.
