



✓ The above-named man, who was recently tried by general court-martial at the Marine barracks, Camp Elliott, I.O.S., Panama, was found guilty of "drunkenness on duty," and sentenced to be confined in such place as the convening authority may designate for a period of one (1) year; then to be dishonorably discharged from the United States Marine Corps; to perform hard labor during said confinement, and after his accrued pay and allowances shall have discharged his indebtedness to the United States at the date of approval of this sentence, to forfeit all pay and allowances that may become due him except the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) per month for necessary prison expenses and a further sum of twenty dollars (\$20.00) to be paid him when discharged from the service pursuant to this sentence.

The Department on June 14, 1913, approved the proceedings, findings, and sentence, of the general court-martial in this case, but but mitigated the sentence to detention in a U. S. Naval Disciplinary Barracks, subject to the conditions and benefits specified in "Addenda to Rules and Regulations for the Government of United States Naval Prisons, Prison Ships, and Disciplinary Barracks."

✓ The Marine Barracks, Camp Elliott, Isthmian Canal Zone, Panama, has been designated as the place of confinement until opportunity offers to transfer Gagg by public conveyance to the United States. If the first such conveyance proceeds to the West Coast, the U. S. Naval Disciplinary Barracks at Puget Sound is designated as the place for the execution of so much of the sentence as relates to detention as remains unexecuted at the time of transfer; or, if the first such conveyance proceeds to the East Coast, the U. S. Naval Disciplinary Barracks at Port Royal, S. C. is designated as the place of detention.



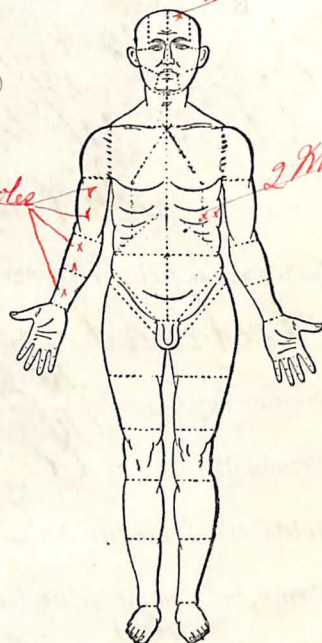

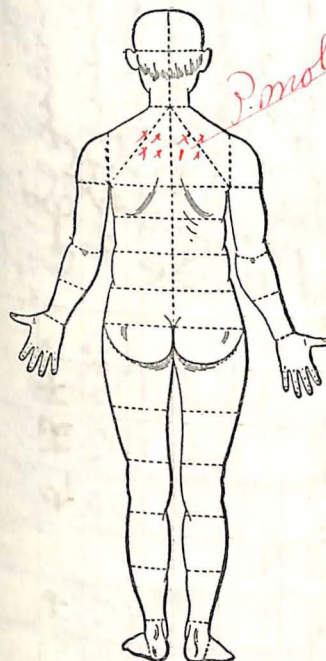

The Department on June 14, 1913, approved the proceedings, findings, and sentence, of the general court-martial in this case but mitigated the sentence to detention in a U.S. Naval Disciplinary Barracks, subject to the conditions and benefits specified in "Addenda to Rules and Regulations for the Government of United States Naval Prisons, Prison Ships, and Disciplinary Barracks.

The Marine Barracks, Camp Elliott, Isthmian Canal Zone, Panama, offers to transfer Gagg by public conveyance to the United States Coast, the U.S. Naval Disciplinary Barracks, at Puget Sound is designated as the place for the execution of so much of the sentence as relates to detention as remains unexecuted at the time of transfer; or, if the first such conveyance proceeds to the East Coast, the U.S. Naval Disciplinary Barracks, at Port Royal S.C., is designated as the place of detention.


