INSTRUCTIONS.

(To be pasted on the inside front cover of service-record books and descriptive books, N. M. C. 109.)

This book becomes a part of the staff returns of a marine, and must accompany him throughout his enlistment. No entries shall be made herein until the man's enlistment is accomplished by administering the oath.

Upon the termination of a marine's service by reason of discharge (issued at the post), retirement, death, or desertion, this book shall be forwarded through official channels to the Major General Commandant for reference to the Adjutant and Inspector's Department. It shall also be forwarded in cases where the discharge certificate is to be prepared at headquarters, viz., upon recommendation for discharge by board of medical survey for disease or injury incurred in the line of duty, and upon expiration of enlistment. In the latter case it will be forwarded from posts and stations east of the Mississippi River fifteen days, and from posts and stations west of the Mississippi River twenty-five days, prior to the expiration of term of service.

Entries shall be made throughout the book in accordance with the printed headings, especial attention being directed to the following:

ENLISTMENTS.—When a man's enlistment has been accomplished his name, rank, and date of enlistment shall be entered on the front cover; his finger prints shall be taken on pages 2 and 3 in the presence of the officer who administered the oath, and page 1 shall be filled in by such officer and signed by him and the recruit. The certificate on pages 2 and 3 should be filled in and signed by the medical examiner.

PROFESSIONAL AND CONDUCT RECORD.—In filling out the Professional and Conduct Record, pages 4 to 7, markings shall be awarded in three subjects only, and the Average Standing shall be arrived at by dividing the total marks by 3. Markings shall be expressed decimally, computed to the nearest tenth.

Under Professional Qualifications only one mark shall be given. This mark shall be entered in the column Proficiency in Rank and shall be indicative of the commanding officer's estimate of the man's value as a soldier, including zeal, intelligence, manner of performing duty, military bearing, cleanliness, proficiency in drills, and all matters pertaining to the duties of a marine; except that Obedience and Sobriety shall not be taken into consideration in awarding marks for Professional Qualifications. These subjects shall be marked separately and in accordance with recorded offenses. No separate mark shall be given for Cleanliness.

When no offense is entered in a man's service-record book, he shall receive a mark denoting Excellent (4.5 to 5) in Obedience and Sobriety, except that during period of instruction at recruit depots minor offenses not reported to commanding officer for action shall not be entered in the service-record book, but shall be taken into consideration in assigning above marks.

Markings in Obedience and Sobriety shall be given in every case upon transfer or when the book is closed, no matter how short a period of service is involved, and shall be for such period only, prior markings being ignored. Should the period of service be too short to enable the officer signing the entry to judge of the man's Professional Qualifications, no arithmetical mark shall be given under that head, but instead the word "None" shall be entered, and in such cases the average standing shall be arrived at by dividing the total marks by 2.

JOININGS.—When a man joins, surrenders, or is apprehended, entry thereof shall be made on pages 4 to 7.

SEMIANNUAL MARKINGS.—Beginning December 31, 1911, markings for professional qualifications and conduct shall be entered semiannually in red ink on pages 4 to 7, the abbreviation "Semi-an." being entered in the column "Transferred, Discharged, Died, etc.," followed by the date in its regular column. Markings on transfer shall be taken into consideration in making the next semiannual marking after transfer.

With recruits the first marks shall be given upon completion of course at, or upon transfer from, depot, and these marks shall be considered in assigning the next succeeding semiannual markings, unless they represent a period of less than two months' service, when they shall be disregarded.

For the first entry under Professional and Conduct Record at each station or vessel, the column "Station or Vessel" shall be filled out with the name of the station or vessel, and subsequent markings while at the same station or vessel will require no entry in this column.

TRANSFERS.—When a man is transferred, proper entries shall be made on pages 4 to 7 and 9 to 13.

DESERTION.—Should a man desert, proper entries shall be made on pages 4 to 7 (giving "0" in obedience) and 9 to 13. On pages 9 to 13 entries shall be made of such, if any, of the following circumstances attending the desertion as may be known: Disposal of effects, especially uniforms; secret preparations for desertion; procuring plain clothes; declarations to comrades and known desire to quit the service; taking passage for distant point; escaping from arrest and quitting the immediate vicinity of his station or duty; the commission of an offense and fear of punishment therefor. If nothing is known of intention to desert, a statement to that effect shall be made. Entry shall also be made of the hour and date, place or port of desertion, and whether or not a reward has been offered. A copy of the reward offered, if any, shall be forwarded with the book to headquarters.

DEATH.—In the event of death, proper entries shall be made on pages 4 to 7; also the hour, date, place and cause of death, and date and place of burial, or disposition of remains.

RETIREMENT.—When a man is retired, entries shall be made as in case of transfer, and the book forwarded to headquarters.

DISCHARGE.—Before the service-record book is forwarded to headquarters for preparation of discharge certificate, the commanding officer shall enter in red ink, on pages 4 to 7, the markings to which the man is entitled for service while under his command since last semiannual marking, the abbreviation "For Dis." being used in the column provided therefor. On the following line shall be entered, after the word "Final," the marking to which he is entitled for the whole of his service.

When a man is discharged before the staff returns are forwarded to headquarters, markings shall be given on pages 4 to 7 in the same manner as when the service-record book is forwarded to headquarters for preparation of discharge certificate, except that the final marking shall not be entered until the discharge has been effected, and that instead of using the word "Final" the word "Discharged" shall be entered in the column provided therefor, followed by the date of discharge.

FINAL MARKINGS.—The final markings of men who have enlisted since June 30, 1911, shall be an arithmetical average of all semiannual markings and the last marking for service at the post, "For Discharge," which last marking shall be given its proportionate value according to length of time covered.

For the final markings of other men, a mathematical average of all markings given prior to July 1, 1911, shall be obtained, taking into consideration the period of service at each place where markings were given; and this average shall be combined with the semiannual markings given (beginning December 31, 1911) and the last marking.

Being given to each according to the following table:

In closing service record books, it will be necessary to enter in each subject under professional and conduct the final mark to which the man is entitled, as well as to ascertain and record his final average standing, in view of the fact that parchment discharge certificate give the markings attained by the man in proficiency, in obedience, and in sobriety.

The final markings of other men, a mathematical average of the final markings given prior to July 1, 1911, shall be obtained, taking into consideration the period of service at each place where markings were given; and this average shall be combined with the final marking given (beginning December 31,

When closing service record books, it will be necessary to ascertain and record the final mark to which the marine is entitled in each subject under professional and conduct record, as well as to ascertain and record his final average standing. Review of the fact that parchment discharge certificates will hereafter give the markings attained by the man in military proficiency, in obedience, and in sobriety.

When the discharge has been effected *before* the book is forwarded the date of discharge, reason therefor, and character given shall be entered on the back cover; and when good-conduct insignia has been awarded, a statement to that effect, given the number of medal or bar, shall be made.

When the final marking is 4.5 or over ("Excellent") on expiration of enlistment, a man will ordinarily be awarded a good-conduct medal. The medal will not be awarded, however, if during his current enlistment the man has been convicted by a general or naval summary court-martial.

At posts having a company organization the markings shall be entered personally and signed by the man's company commander, who shall also make recommendations as to good-conduct medals and bars. In cases where the commanding officer of a post does not agree with the markings given by the company commander, or the recommendations in regard to good-conduct medal or bar, his recommendations, with reasons therefor, shall be given over his signature. In the case of a general court-martial prisoner, additional signed entry shall be made, pages 4 to 7, to show what was actually furnished him upon discharge, including the amount of cash paid, whether or not it included transportation, and whether or not clothing was furnished.

EXPEDITIONS, distinguished service, letters of commendation badges awarded, etc., shall be noted on page 8.

OFFENSES committed and punishments or warnings awarded shall be entered on pages 9 to 13. The record of these offenses and punishments or warnings shall be made when the action is taken, and shall be signed (on transfer, desertion, etc., and semiannually) when the professional and conduct record is signed. When a man is in the hands of the civil authorities, the hours and dates from and to which so detained, whether absent without leave when arrested, offense charged, and whether convicted or acquitted, shall be entered.

COURTS-MARTIAL.—A brief abstract of general and summary courts-martial and deck courts shall be entered on or attached to pages 9 to 13, the approving authority (G. C. M., convening authority; S. C. M., senior officer present; D. C., convening authority) being shown, together with date of approval.

PROMOTIONS AND REDUCTIONS shall be noted on page 14.

DETAILS on extra or special duty shall be noted on page 15.

MARKSMANSHIP shall be recorded on pages 16 to 18.

In making entries in this book the strictest economy of space must be observed, no blank lines being left between entries. If more space is needed, additional pages should be inserted.

NOTE.—The pages mentioned in these instructions refer to pages in the edition of the service-record book printed 8-8-11. In filling out the certificate on the inside back cover of other editions of the service-record book in the case of men discharged before the staff returns are forwarded, necessary changes shall be made in the printed form to comply with these instructions. In forwarding descriptive books to headquarters the certificate required on the inside back cover of service-record books shall be entered in accordance with Marine Corps General Order No. 30, of May 10, 1909, as amended by General Orders Nos. 57 and 56. In making in prior editions of the service-record book and in descriptive books the other entries herein directed to be made in the service-record book of 8-8-11, the entries shall be made in places and under headings corresponding to those described as nearly as may be.

No entries are required in the Health Record forming part of or attached to prior editions of the service-record book and descriptive books, a separate medical record having been issued for every enlisted man.

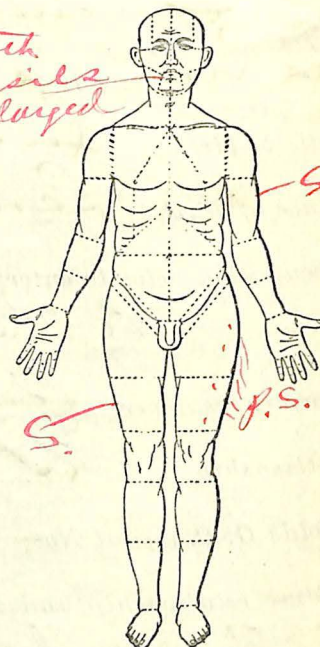

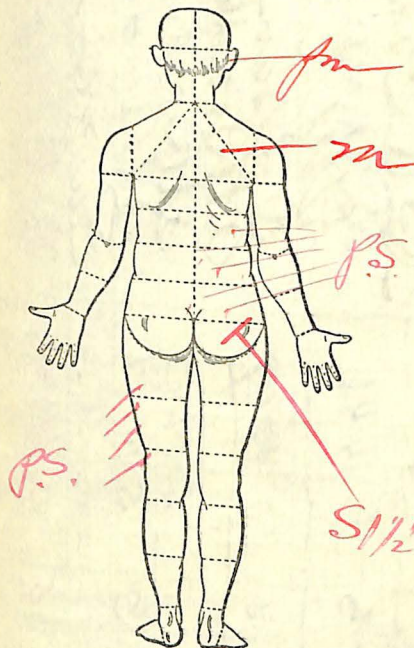
