





In recommending the character to be given a marine on discharge, the nature of his service during the entire period of his current enlistment, as shown by his descriptive list and conduct record, will govern, due weight being given to the markings of his former commanding officers and the opportunities possessed by such commanding officers for arriving at their conclusions, as indicated by the respective periods the marine served under them, being duly considered.

2. In no case will a marine who has been legally convicted by a court martial, and the sentence of such court been approved by proper authority, be recommended for character "excellent."

8. Commanding officers will also carefully consider the fact that the markings given the marine during his recruit service will necessarily not be excellent. Should commanding officers, therefore, give undue weight to such markings, only reenlisted marines could ever receive character "excellent."

4. The desired end to be obtained is that the character given the marine on discharge shall reflect and be exactly descriptive of the man's general service in the Marine Corps during the enlistment from which the particular discharge releases him.

In every case of transfer a note should be made in the proper place as to a man's qualification in marksmanship and the range fired on.

effect, given the number of medal or bar, shall be made.
When the final marking is 4.5 or over ("Excellent") on expiration of enlistment, a man will ordinarily be awarded a good-conduct medal. The medal will not be awarded, however, if during his current enlistment the man has been convicted by a

general or naval summary court-martial.

At posts having a company organization the markings shall be entered personally and signed by the man's company commander, who shall also make recommendations as to good-conduct medals and bars. In cases where the commanding officer of a post does not agree with the markings given by the company commander, or the recommendations in regard to good-conduct medal or bar, his recommendations, with reasons therefor, shall be given over his signature. In the case of a general court-martial prisoner, additional signed entry shall be made, pages 4 to 7, to show what was actually furnished him upon discharge, including the amount of cash paid, whether or not it included transportation, and whether or not clothing was furnished.

Expeditions, distinguished service, letters of commendation, badges awarded, etc., shall be noted on page 8.

Offenses committed and punishments or warnings awarded shall be entered on pages 9 to 13. The record of these offenses and punishments or warnings shall be made when the action is taken. taken, and shall be signed (on transfer, desertion, etc., and semiannually) when the professional and conduct record is signed. When a man is in the hands of the civil authorities, the hours and dates from and to which so detained, whether absent without leave when arrested, offense charged, and whether
