MARINE CORPS RESERVE for a term of FOUR YEARS, in accordance with the act of Congress approved August 29, 1916 (see note), do declare that I am of legal age to enroll, and believe myself to be physically qualified to perform the duties of an able-bodied marine; that I am of good habits and character in all respects; that I have never been convicted by a civil court of any offense; that I have never deserted from the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard or Revenue-Cutter Service, or been discharged therefrom or from any other service, except with good character, and for the reasons given by me to the enrolling officer; and that I am a citizen of the United States, and am a volunteer for general service.

I agree to accept from the United States such retainer pay, rations, and clothing as are or may be established by law.

NOTE.—Congressional Enactment, August 29, 1916: "Enrollment and reenrollment shall be for terms of four years, but members SHALL in time of peace, when no national emergency exists, be discharged upon their own request upon reimbursing the Government for any clothing gratuity that may have been furnished them during their current enrollment."



1. When articles of clothing and equipment are issued to an enlisted man they will be entered in the «Issue» column, with the date of issue entered in figures (e. g., 10/30/17) on the date line. The column will be initialed by the witnessing officer and, except in the case of issue of clothing, by the soldier, a line being drawn through each blank space in the column by the witnessing officer. When articles are first issued to an enlisted man the sizes that have been determined to be the proper ones will be entered in column headed «size.»

2. When articles are turned in, lost, damaged, or destroyed, they will be entered in a column under the heading «Turned in.» and the column completed and initialed by an officer and the soldier as in the case of issues. The officer who receives the articles turned in or enters the articles lost, damaged, or destroyed on statement of charges will initial the column. (117, 685—687, A. R.)

3. When an individual equipment record form is filled a new one will be started and the old record retained with the individual clothing slips (Q. M. C. Form No. 165) pertaining thereto, until the next inspection by an inspector, after which all filled individual equipment records and clothing slips may be destroyed. When a new equipment record is started the number of articles transferred will be entered in first issue column of new record, and the column initialed as prescribed in paragraph 1.

4. No record will be made of a transaction where an article is turned in and replaced by a like article at the same time.

5. When a soldier is transferred or detached from his company the word «canceled» will be written in columns showing articles issued and turned in to date. The articles which the soldier carries with him, or for which he is indebted to the United States, will then be entered in the next issue column, the column being initialed by the soldier and witnessing officer, as prescribed in paragraph 1. These articles, except clothing and individual mess equipment, will be entered on Form No. 600, A. G. O., as required by paragraph 681-O, A. R. The individual equipment record will be forwarded with the service record to the soldier's new commanding officer.



(b) **Failure to qualify.**—Should a soldier in the year following his original or any subsequent qualification fail to qualify or qualify in a grade different from that previously held, the date (not inclusive) the soldier completes the record practice qualification course and failed to qualify, or the date of the new classification attained, if any, will be entered in the appropriate space.

PROMOTIONS AND REDUCTIONS.

3. Enter the kind of warrant given or revoked, as the case may be, *e. g.*, permanent, temporary, recruiting, etc., the rank to which promoted or reduced, and the actual date of promotion or reduction.

4. **Absence without or over leave.**—Under the headings "From" and "To," enter the *date and hour* from which and to which the man was absent without or over leave in excess of one day, and in the column headed "Days A. (c) When a book is finally closed on account of discharge, death, or retirement, the total time lost for absence without or over leave, for causes specified in the Act of August 29, 1916, and while in confinement, will be entered in the space provided in the lower right-hand corner of the page.

(d) See Marine Corps Orders No. 11, Series, 1915.

ALLOTMENTS.

8.
