#### "Ward" U.S. General Hospital, Newark, N.J., November 3, 1864.

GENERAL ORDER, No 3.

The Legislature of New Jersey having denied the elective franchise to its soldiers absent from their homes, the honorable Secretary of War has authorized the Surgeon in Charge to grant furloughs until the 12th of November to New Jersey soldiers who may desire to vote at the coming election.

These furloughs will be granted as speedily as possi-

ble.

The Surgeon in Charge trusts that this favor (for it is a favor) of the General Government will not be abused by those who are its recipients.

Let no act of any soldier, furloughed from this Hospital, while among his friends or relatives, cast a stain upon his good name as a soldier and a gentleman.

The Army in general will be judged by the actions and conduct of those of its representatives at home. Let each man then feel that not only his own good name but the honor of his comrades and of the Service is for the time in his keeping, and dependent upon his behaviour; and let him resolve, that, as far as in him lies, the people shall see that the valor and prowess of New Jersey's soldiers in the field is not more conspicuous than the gentlemanly deportment and good conduct of

these same soldiers when at their homes.

Especially does the Surgeon in Charge desire to caution them against intoxication and participation in political broils and the fighting consequent thereon. He knows from experience how hard it is to stand quietly and hear the valor of our arms disparaged, our victories denied, and the actions of our enemies lauded or excused; yet he would remind the soldiers under his command that a soldier, enlisted to enforce law and order, should be the last one to break the laws and to add to that spirit of lawless violence which, as is shown by the frequent and disgraceful appeals to mob law, is already too widely prevalent. While giving utterance to your views, at all times and places, as becomes citizen soldiers, leave to the proper authorities the time and mode of punishment due those who transgress the laws. The vaporings of the few cowardly Rebels, sprinkled throughout the North, can perhaps be tolerated when the discomfiture of Rebels, North and South, is made so certain by the glorious triumphs which must, at no distant day, crown our arms with complete

The soldier must report promptly on the 12th day of November, at this Hospital. His neglect so to do will render him liable to the punishment due those absent without leave or deserting, which punishment will most certainly be inflicted, if incurred. Absolute inability to travel will alone excuse a soldier from reporting, and then only when the certificate described in the printed note upon the back of the furlough is sent as there di-

rected.

#### READ THIS.

The within named soldier must report at the Hespital on the day fixed for the expiration of his furlough. No plea of sickness will excuse him from the charge of **DESERTION** unless he furnishes a certificate from an army Medical Officer or a regular practicing Physician. If from the latter it must be sworn to before a magistrate, who must certify to the good standing of the Physician.

This certificate will be of no value unless it describes clearly the nature of the disability, and declares explicitly that the patient is thereby rendered unable to travel (by the ordinary mode of conveyance) to the "Ward" U. S. General Hospital, Newark, N. J.; nor will any one certificate cover a longer period than Twenty days.

The certificate should be mailed so as to reach the Hospital prior to the expiration of the furlough, and should be addressed upon the envelope, to:
